We welcome all to today's mass especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

The Kingdom of God which the Gospel promotes is often pictured as a banquet for everyone and an occasion of sharing and joyfulness in contrast to the sinister atmosphere at the dinner to which Jesus was invited in today's Gospel where the people watched him closely to 'catch him out'. Jesus shared two parables; in response to the way the guests pick the places of honour and on who is deserving of invitation. As Jesus spoke, perhaps some of the guests begin to feel uncomfortable. Perhaps some are dissatisfied because others had a higher place than they. But where was Jesus sitting? Do you think he cared very much? If you were there, would you have cared? Do you feel your worth as a person depends on how you are treated on such occasions? The point Jesus makes is that in the Kingdom of God such things have absolutely no importance. The only status that counts is one's relationship with God and with other people, irrespective of their classification by race, religion, profession or class. Those who find their security in their bonds of love with other people know that no status is lost by having to sit near the kitchen. In fact, it rather gives them an opportunity to talk to the cook and the staff who are often forgotten. In the second parable, Jesus advocates that we invite those people in particular who are unable to give us something in return; who will be able to do absolutely nothing to further our aspirations. Life can be seen as a ladder or a circle. Many of us live on a ladder, desperately trying to climb to the top. In so doing we often find ourselves climbing on the backs of others and even kicking them to the bottom so that we can reach the top. We are by and large a ladder society. To be in the first place is the norm today. The Gospel is proposing that we rather try to work towards creating a circle society where there is no top or bottom. All are equal. All are facing each other. All are in a better position to know and respect each other for how can you respect the person you are climbing over to get to the top of the ladder? In a circle society, all are in a better position to share what they have with those who have less. And, as the story goes, provide each person with a chopstick too long to be used by oneself but just the right length to offer food to the person opposite and you have the Kingdom in the making.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the R lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be R humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.' He said also to the man who had invited him, When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'
