

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

It is important for all the Christians to keep in mind that the Gospel is not a heavy burden to add to the many problems we already have in life. It is, instead, proclamation of happiness in our lives. We are told, in the first two readings, that cheerfulness of the Christians comes from the Lord who is among us from the fact that evil has been defeated. Life has meaning. Even when it looks like a failure, because God loves humankind and has a plan of happiness for each one of us, a plan that God is going to implement. The Gospel is showing us three attitudes we must assume if we want to experience the joy promised to those who welcome Christ; share the goods we possess, avoid injustices, and stop oppressing people John's message relates to the joy which will be experienced when the Saviour comes. Conversion is a way of cleaning one's way of life and being in state of grace to welcome the Lord. John's call to make ready the way for the Lord needs a genuine conversion of our hearts. There are some concrete ways of life John the Baptist has suggested, to people of different walks of life as they prepare for the coming of the Lord. John advocates for change in the lifestyle that will result to a change of heart. If conversion truly takes place in our Christian life, it should be reflected in our actions and attitudes. Our prayers this day should be that the Lord enlighten our minds, deliver us from all fear and make us totally open to His Grace so that we may grasp the deep meaning of our existence. Let the Lord give us the hunger for the life of Christ who comes to bring joy not suffering. May we encounter the Lord in every person we meet at Christmas and along our life's journey to God.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, 'I baptise you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people.
