The Presentation of The Lord Year C

2nd February 2025



We welcome all to today's mass especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

On this feast of the presentation we contemplate about the Lord Jesus, whom Mary & Joseph bring to the Temple "to present Him to the Lord." Simeon the old man identifies Him as "a light for Revelation to the Gentiles", and announces with prophetic words his supreme offering to God, and His final victory (Luke 2: 32-35). This is the meeting point of the old and the new Testament. Jesus enters the ancient temple, He who is the New Temple of God. He comes to visit his people, thus bringing to fulfilment obedience to the Law and ushering in, the last times of salvation. It is interesting to note, that with all the comings and going at the temple including Priests and Levites, taking their turns doing duty there, as well as devout people and pilgrims all anxious to encounter the God of Israel, none of them noticed anything special. Jesus & his parents just passed in like any other family. The Messiah our Saviour was there. Only two old people, Simeon & Anna discovered the divine reality. Led by the Holy Spirit, they find the fulfilment of their long waiting & watching, in this child Jesus. We, today, must try to experience something of joy at their encounter with the Redeemer.

She did not depart from the Temple, worshipping with fasting and prayer night and day. And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to

speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem. And when they had performed every thing according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favour of God was upon him.
