REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

In today's Gospel, Jesus declares, "I am the vine and you are the branches... cut off from me, you can do nothing." Jesus is not just one inspiring guru or teacher. No other religious leader ever made such claims. And it is not the first time he will be making such absolute sweeping claims. He had once declared, "Unless you eat my body and drink my blood you will not have life in you." This made many of his disciples to abandon him. But, instead of retracting or amending his statement, he rather asked the twelve if they too wanted to leave. It was then that Peter responded, "To whom shall we go Lord, you have the word of eternal life." Peter could have been more pointed and say "You ARE the word of eternal life" because Jesus is the "Word made flesh." He is the very embodiment of the word which is the power by which God made and sustains the world. The prologue of St John's Gospel clearly recognised that "All that exist came to be through him." He is the ground for the order and the structure of the universe. In this sense, every human being is rooted in Christ whether they know it or not. Christians have the rare privilege of knowing this "Word made flesh" in a personal way. Why then in the world would we wander away from the one who is the foundation of the universe? The fact is that wherever we go from him in our quest for truth, goodness, beauty or love is a step down, a declining, because in him is the perfection of everything that is good. Only rooted in God can we truly flourish, can we grow to our full potential. That's the insight from the following sad American Indian story. A young man once found an eagle's egg. He puts it into the nest of a broody chicken and the eaglet hatched with the chickens. All her life, she thought that she was a chicken, scratching dirty surfaces in search of food and flying no more than a few feet off the ground. One day, the misplaced eagle saw a magnificent bird soaring gracefully on strong golden wings high above in the sky. She exclaimed, "What a magnificent bird!" She was told that it was an eagle, the chief of the birds and that she should better stop dreaming that she could ever be like her since she was only a chicken. So, the poor eagle never gave it a second thought; she lived and died thinking that she was a chicken. This story underscores that what we identify ourselves with can help bring out the best in us or, on the contrary, help kill the potential in us. The eaglet identified herself with chickens and ended up not being able to fly even though she had all the potential. Jesus defines himself as the "true vine" and we, his followers, as the branches. To flourish, the vine branches must be grafted unto the "true vine" for, as he said, "cut off from me, you can do nothing."

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia

OPENING PRAYER

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

FIRST READING

Acts 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus. The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to. Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

GOSPEL John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away - he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'

FEAST OF THE WEEK

Feast Day: 4th May The Eighty-five Martyrs of England and Wales, also known as George Haydock and Eightyfour Companion Martyrs, are a group of men who were executed on charges of treason and related offences in the Kingdom of England between 1584 and 1679. Of the eighty-five, seventyfive(sixty-one priests and fourteen laymen) were executed under Jesuits, etc. Act 1584.They were beatified on 22 November 1987 by Pope John Paul II. Queen Elizabeth I was excommunicated by Pope Pius V, on 25 February 1570. Once this declaration was made, a number of Catholics were implicated in plots against Elizabeth. In the eves of Elizabeth and her ministers, such opposition was nothing less than high treason. But a large number of English Catholics refused to go so far as rebellion. The next Pope Gregory XIII, made another statement on 14 April. He maintained the excommunication, but did not oblige Catholics to do anything that led to their disadvantage. The laws were tightened after an uprising in the north. Among other things, religious acts were interpreted as treason.
