REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

BE NOT AFRAID

As humans, we pass through different kinds of emotions in our daily living. One of the emotions we face in our society is fear. We may be afraid of meeting people, of trying new things in life, of openly living our convictions and above all, the fear of the unknown. In the opening verse of Matthew 10, Jesus calls and empowers his apostles to perform wonders in their missionary work through the sharing of gifts received spiritually. Jesus knows quite well the numerous challenges awaiting his apostles such as failures, rejection and persecutions. He therefore equips them with the vital tool for their missionary work which is the courage to proclaim openly the good news of the kingdom of God. As privileged apostles, the mysteries of the kingdom are laid bare to them so like good stewards, they are not to keep these things to themselves hence the invitation of Jesus, "what I am telling you in the dark you must repeat in broad daylight, and what you have heard in private you must announce from the housetops." More to that, Jesus tells his apostles, "... You have received without paying, so give without being paid". Also, the apostles are not to fear those who kill externally but cannot kill internally because it is solely in the power of the divine to keep creation going. If the divine takes care of the entire creation, including the minutest elements of creation, how much more will he bring satisfaction to his chosen ones who carry out the missionary mandate? That is the more reason why Jesus insists on his message of encouraging his apostles saying, "Happy are you when people insult you and persecute you and tell all kinds of evil lies against you because you are my followers. Be happy and glad, for a great reward is kept for you in heaven.". One last encouragement Jesus brings in the life of his apostles is the challenge to proclaim his identity and publicly declare him in the presence of all just like Simon Peter proudly declared Jesus before all creation in these words, "You are the messiah, the Son of the living God.". Let us ask ourselves; what fear am I nursing deep within me? Am I inspired by my sacramental life to follow closely the teachings of Christ, ever prepared to take risk in my sharing in the missionary mandate.

But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. SECOND READING Romans 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law. Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
