REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

JESUS BEARS ALL

esus' coming into this world is to constantly guide people to live and see the God present amongst them. He comes to identify with sinful humanity and so save it. Jesus' acts bring out the fact that he is very much aware of his origins, his family history and above all, he knows the mission of God and thus fits himself perfectly into this mission and willingly carries it out. His incarnation in the Jewish milieu provokes a lot of tension and discomfort. The obvious one comes from King Herod who is threatened, and so is everyone else in Jerusalem, on receiving the news of Jesus' birth from the Wise Men. The restlessness in Herod pushes him to plot evil when he says to the Wise Men, 'Go and make a careful search for the child, and when you find him, let me know, so that I too may go and worship him.' (Mt. 2:8) The end result is nasty as it gives rise to the killing of baby boys born around the same period as Jesus. In fidelity to God's design, Jesus calls close collaborators in his mission to spread the good news of the Kingdom of God. These are not the learned, they are not the highly placed in the Jewish society, but they are feeble creatures of God with professions that are not noble. He calls fishermen and tax collectors - the dejected of the society. They are the little ones who are fortunate to have the mysteries of the Kingdom revealed to them. It is not strange that Jesus tells his apostles, 'you have been given the secret of the Kingdom of God... But the others, who are on the outside, hear all things by means of parables, so that, they may look and look, yet not see; they may listen and listen, yet not understand.' (Mk. 4:11-12). However to be a follow of Jesus entails that difficulties, challenges and suffering will come one's way. In the midst of these difficulties, Jesus chooses to bear all our worries and difficulties. He gives his follower a blessed assurance of a good rest. The yoke is heavy and uncomfortable to bear but the ultimate sacrifice of the Word Made Flesh makes it easy and light. The invitation of Jesus is crucial in our faith journey because this points out that Jesus does not call us in order to leave us stranded in our faith journey. He ever supports us as he relieves us of our heavy burdens! Lord Jesus, help us to believe that you are always with us. Amen.
