REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

The Three Paths To Follow

This week's readings speak to us of the paths we could follow in this world. They speak of three paths. Though the Lord might show us one path in preference to the others, one is not to follow one path to the exclusion of the others. These paths are: (i) service; (ii) contemplation; (iii) suffering. The path of service was the path followed by Martha. While she was fretting over her activity, she was missing something very precious which Mary, on the other hand, was enjoying (the word of God). Having lost the word of God, she has lost the true reason for her work. Mary is a prayerful contemplative soul. The soul always seeks humbly to be with God; to listen to the word of God, devotedly and lovingly. All of us, although not belonging to a contemplative institute must be contemplatives in action. St. Paul on sufferings says: "I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the Church (Col 1,24). Suffering has a sanctifying value, because it purifies sentiments, transforms impulses and passions, detaches from the fleeting goods of the world, elevates to the contemplation of our eternal destiny. We are called to perform various tasks in life. They must however be fulfilled while listening to the word of God, giving hospitality to God. God then will transform our hearts, transform our inner being and creates in us a newness of life.

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

FIRST READING (Genesis 18:1-10)

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say. Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said, 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ.
