

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

BETWEEN GOOD AND EVIL

An Indian fable has it that an old Cherokee taught his grandson about good and evil by an illustration of a battle going on inside him. He says, "The battle is between two wolves. One is evil: Anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority and ego... The other is good: joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion and faith...' The grandson thought for awhile and asked: "Which wolf wins?" The old Cherokee simply replied: "The one I feed." The exercise of making a choice between good and evil lies at the very foundations we lay for our happiness or sadness, salvation or damnation. The fable of the old Cherokee gives the impression that one can attain it by simply opting to feed one and starve the other. That decision is a hard nut! Perhaps, the undoing of our consumeristic generation is the erroneous conclusion that what is popular is good. That logic is gravely faulty! It holds that if you have a large followership on your twitter, Tiktok, Snapchat, Flickr, LinkedIn, Facebook, WhatsApp, Instagram, etc, then you are good. That which is truly good endures. That which is good is a treasure and those who find it, do not only preserve what they find, they are also preserved by their find. A classic example is the kingdom of heaven. The person who finds it gives up everything to possess it because it fulfils all our innermost yearnings. Indeed, myriad of seemingly beautiful options in the world can be likened to the haul of a dragnet. It requires more than the capacity of our stained will to pick the good and reject the evil. The prayer of Solomon (1st Reading.) will always come handy, "Lord, give your servant a heart to discern between good and evil..."
