REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

The Poor Rich Man

n today's gospel a man asks Jesus to help make his brother give him his share of the family inheritance. Jesus is not against justice being done between him and his brother. Jesus is rather disappointed that after listening to his preaching, the man's first concern still remained his share of inheritance. He therefore cautions his listeners "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions" At first, it may seem that the man was only after justice but Jesus recognises that greed comes in different guises, even in the guise of justice. That's what happens when some respectable people oppose plans to improve conditions for those on benefits. They sound as though they argue for justice and fairness but it could indeed be greed in disguise. That's why Jesus cautions with emphasis "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed" Greed can be upfront or subtle, conscious or unconscious. What we are is of far greater importance than what we have. When one is so consumed with the things that one could have, so much so that one no longer hears the urgent call of God, then one has indeed got one's priorities all mixed up. That is the lesson from the rich fool in today's Gospel. There is a belief, that once we have material and financial security, all our problems will be solved. Yet, we see this approach contradicted every single day. Today's readings ask us to consider another approach altogether. Jesus is not saying that you must give up all these things and lead a life of bleak misery for his sake. On the contrary, against the greed that obsesses many people he offers a much more secure way to happiness - sharing. For the rich fool, it was all about himself and the enjoyment that awaits him following his rich harvest. It is worth observing that no other people are mentioned in the story. The world and all its goods were there purely and simply for him to take hold of and keep for himself. But that very night he got a fatal lesson on the vanity of material security. Jesus teaches that we do not need the security of an inheritance or winning the lottery. Our security comes from being part of a loving and caring community, taking care of each member's needs. The old divisions that brought so much distress must fall away. Real security is not in the future. Genuine security is in the here and now, in having the sense of our common humanity.

FIRST READING (Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23)

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity! This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

R. O Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to the next.

SECOND READING (Colossians 3:1-5.9-11)

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ is God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you, too, will be revealed in all your glory with him. That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is

renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythians, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.
