

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

COURAGE FEAR NOT

When the disciples are in difficulties Jesus comes to their aid. Fear makes faith weak and one becomes an obstacle to God's love and power. Jesus, God made man, breaks the laws of nature to be with his disciples. The disciples, on their part, become surprised. They take what they see for a bad vision. The word of Jesus gives them hope. The presence of Jesus calms the storm of our lives but still many of us remain in a state of disbelief. Jesus reveals himself, not as a master of the fearful disciples, but as God "I am." If one does not believe with an open heart in the surprises of God, the visions are useless. Lord, your walking on the water or calming the storm does not surprise or impress me so much. After all, you have total control over the power of nature. What fills me with awe and delight is the fact that you come to the aid of your disciples in times of peril. You would be willing to do any miracles to protect them, to save them. Today, for me, the big miracle is not that you walked on the water, but that you are already with me (us) in my (our) boat. Thank you, Lord, for you came, bringing us peace in the midst of our storms. Thank you, above all, for getting into our boat and staying with us all through the journey. You really do not need to get in but you get into our boat for our own sake.
