We welcome all to today's Mass, especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Jesus had to ask them in today's Gospel: "Who do you say I am?" Instructively, he asked this question in the region of Caesarea Philippi, a city known for its many gods, hence the right place to determine people's affiliations and resolve any crises of religious identity. In a way it mirrors our society today where so many compelling voices compete for our attention that we may not know which to follow or the true content of things we sign up to. Going from the public to the individual Jesus began by asking them: "Who do people say I am?" The disciples repeat the various speculations of the crowd: "Some say you are John the Baptist, others say you are Elijah, others one of the ancient prophets ..." None of this is correct. The mob is usually wrong. You therefore need to hold your own personal convictions. Hence, Jesus pointedly asked them: "But you, who do you say I am?" Speaking on behalf of the others Peter declares: "You are the Christ (the Messiah), Son of the living God!" And he is correct! Yet, as the dialogue progressed, it will become clear that they lacked the full understanding of what being the Messiah will mean for Jesus. St. Paul in the 2nd Reading came to surrender that the mind of God is inexplicable and his ways unfathomable. He had tried in vain to reconcile the position of Israel as the Chosen people of God and that of Christians as the new people of God but in a twist of fate, the dilemma suddenly enlightens him that God's ways transcend human reasoning. Indeed some things in our faith make sense but there are loads that don't make sense. Think about the suffering of the innocent, children dying of cancer, landslides, earthquakes and tsunamis flattening lives and communities. Yes, it would be naive and superstitious if we, as humans, don't ask any questions. Hence, like St. Paul, we think these things through but it makes sense that we recognise and also appreciate the limit of our comprehension. Therefore, I can only come to a prayerful surrender trusting that ultimately everything works unto good for them that love God (Romans 8:28).
