REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

The Narrow Gate or Path of Self Denial that Opens on to Love and Life.

As we gather for today's Mass of the twenty first Sunday of the liturgical year C of the Church, we are full of joy. We come together to praise God and to give Him thanks. Yet sometimes we have to read those passages of scripture which are not joyful, but which act as warnings to us. Today Christ warns us to choose the narrow path of truth, for otherwise He will say to us: I do not know you - away from me.' The Man we hear about in the gospel today wanted to know something that lay in the future. The important thing is to make sure about the future not simply to know about it. When Jesus speaks about the narrow gate or path, He is using a figure of speech: He is comparing the Kingdom of heaven to something. The Kingdom is not a place. It is a state of existence; a state of being. It is a state where we are utterly in love with God. When Jesus compares our entry into the Kingdom to passing through a narrow gate, He wants us to understand that entry into the Kingdom is a very personal matter. That is something that the Jewish people listening to Jesus did not clearly understand. They thought that because they belonged to the chosen people of Israel, and Jesus was one of themselves that they were thereby guaranteed entrance into the Kingdom. "Lord, we heard you preach in our street, we shared a meal with you." But the Lord will say, "I do not know you." We would have the same mentality if we were to say, "Yes Lord, we have been present at Mass, we have listened to the homilies or sermons in the church, we have taken part in parish activities." All very fine. But the trouble is that all these things could exist without true love in the essence of the Kingdom. Without love, no matter what else I may have, I cannot belong to the Kingdom of God or heaven. And there can be no love without self-denial. It is true I must love myself but my love must not stop there. I must reach out in equal measure.

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all day long.

OPENING PRAYER

O God, who causes the minds of the faithful to unite in a single purpose, grant your people to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that amid the uncertainties of the world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness is found. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 66:18-21)

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

SECOND READING (Hebrews 12:5-7.11-13)

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; there the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

GOSPEL (Luke 13:22-30)

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed. 'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying. "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!" 'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God. 'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'
