We welcome all to today's Mass, especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Today, the church reminds us of the most important theological virtue, 'love'. In a most special way, Jesus gives us the two dimensions of love. The vertical love of God, and the horizontal-love of neighbour. With these two forms of love, when perfectly practiced, a Christian can conveniently talk of 'living well'. The Pharisees posed Christ another "difficult" question: "Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?" As usual, this was in order to test him. A close look at Jesus' response today, reveals that Jesus presents us with, first the vertical dimension of love: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your soul...." It is important to note that to love God with one's body and soul requires a lot of sacrifice, and humility. To love God is the most important prerequisite of being like him. The second dimension of love is the horizontal: "You must love your neighbour as yourself?" This is more difficult than the first. This is because, we neglect and take it for granted. This is, by thinking that we can love God alone without loving our neighbours. Hence, Christ reminds us that: "If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1Jn 4, 20). So, the best way of expressing our love for God is through our neighbours. We must affect others positively in order to love God well. Saint Augustine admonishes us; "... Love God, and do whatever you will". Let the root of love be within, of this root can nothing spring but what is good." This is absolutely right because, it is through our neighbours that we worship and love God. When we find God, we find our own peace and love. The value of one's life is measured by the lives it touched positively. So, with the psalmist, let us proclaim: "I love you Lord, my strength."

This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only through Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.
