REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Standing out to see God

Zacchaeus has fraudulently enriched himself as Chief tax collector yet he is a desperate man; something is lacking and he desperately needs to catch a glimpse of God. But he could not see Jesus because he is so short. Sin has diminished him. The bible tells us that when we sin, we fall short of the glory of God. But just as we saw last Sunday with the story of the self righteous Pharisee and the sinful but humble tax collector, today's Gospel continues the theme of God's attitude towards the sinner and the social outcast. As chief tax collector, Zacchaeus was the most disgusting creature in the community. However, in spite of being a rich and important man, he had the humility to climb a tree to get a view of Jesus. Very often we are not able to see Jesus in our lives because we are crowded by people whose views hinder us from expressing our faith. To see Jesus clearly we often have to get away from such crowd and risk being different, risk losing our standing before such people as Zacchaeus did in climbing a tree. To the utter dismay of the crowd, Jesus reached out in love to Zacchaeus. "Hurry and come down" he told him, "for I must stay at your house today". It must have shocked the watching crowd that Jesus did not tell him off or preached that he must repent or perish as they had expected. Yet, the non-judgmental approach of Jesus and his unconditional acceptance of the sinful Zacchaeus spoke more eloquently to Zacchaeus' heart than the best sermon ever could. Zacchaeus stood up and declared that he would give half of his possessions to the poor and will pay back four times to anyone he has defrauded. By giving half of his wealth to the poor and using the other half to repay four times all those he had defrauded, Zacchaeus' wealth is virtually gone. But who needs all that money when you have found a meaningful life? Jesus said that he came to seek out and to save the lost which include those regarded as sinners and those who are marginalised by so-called respectable society. As disciples of Jesus, we Christians are also expected to pay special attention to all around us, who, like Zacchaeus must be feeling judged and condemned. When we embrace them unconditionally and non-judgmentally, we might be surprised to see how effectively we are spreading the Good News of God's love in a way that touches their hearts more than any amount of preaching can do.
