

# **REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL**

THE SHEKINAH GLORY IS IN YOU NOT IN ORDINARY BUILDING. 'Some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts". Herod the Great altered and enlarged the temple complex. He expanded and beautified it to such an extent that it could pass for a new temple. He began to build it about the year 19 BC, and the workmen were not discharged until the procuratorship of Albinus in 63 AD. Some of the stones in the building of the temple were sixty-seven and half feet in length, seven and half feet in height and nine feet in breadth. The exterior of the temple was covered on every side with massive plates of gold, so that as soon as the sun rose, it radiated a fiery flash that those straining to look at it were forced to avert their eyes as from the rays of the sun. The Jews used to say: "He who has not seen the temple in its full construction has never in his life seen a glorious building." Of this temple Jesus spoke: "As for these things that you see, the day will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down" (Lk 21, 6). The temple was destroyed in 70 AD. The Jews trusted in the material building of the temple. We must not place our trust in material things. Often we are concerned about putting up a beautiful building. What is more important is the people. The Church is the people of God. We must be more concerned with the people than with the building. Jesus tells us today: "By your endurance you will gain your souls". Each of us has a soul. Having a soul is different from gaining it. We can gain it only by practising virtue. As we are celebrating the Golden Jubilee of our church building, Jesus is using it to call us to build a church for him in Archway: a church that is a family of people of God, based on solidarity, love, caring, sacrifice, and charity. The temple of Jerusalem did not last, although it was very beautiful and costly. We are God's temple (1 Cor 3, 16). We are destined to last forever.



# SECOND READING (2 Thessalonians 3:7-12)

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you.

This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow. We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

# GOSPEL (Luke 21: 5-19)

When some are talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said: "All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed." And they put to him this question: "Master," they said "when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?" "Take care not to be deceived." he said "because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon." Then he said to them, "Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there: there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name, and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betraved even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives."
