REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

Courage – the Liberation Is Near at Hand

Most People like to anticipate things and be prepared for them. However, we are more prone to believe bad news rather than good. When things go bad, we tend to believe that worse will follow. Believers are challenged to hope and believe that God will make things work for the best. There is a proverb that goes, "No night is so long and dark that it has no dawn." In the life of the Church, of the world, of a nation, of every man and woman, no situation is so bad that it does not contain signs of hope. This Sunday's first reading taken from the Book of the Prophet Daniel 12:1-13, and the Gospel taken from the Gospel according to Mark 13:24-32, invite us to discover the signs of the coming of a new world. The second reading which comes from the letter to the Hebrews 10:11-14, 18 compares the priesthood of Christ with that of the Old Covenant. Not even the worst thing that can happen to us, sin, can be a cause of discouragement to us, because Christ has already overpowered it. Have a hope-filled weekend!

The Prayer Of the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
