# **REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL**

Having come thus far in our journey, the Church says to us as the prophet Nehemiah said to the Israelites: "Ge and enjoy...Do not grieve, for the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Neh 8, 10). However, after today, we must continue our journey with a new zeal and expectation. Therefore, for Gaudate Sunday to be truly meaningful, it must provoke a great feeling of joy and thankfulness, while still strongly preserving, and keeping us focused on our journey and duty this glorious season of Advent. It is not the end our journey. Today our gospel is about the prophecy and clarion call of the "Prophet of Prophets," John the Baptist. The major difference between today's gospel and that of last week rests simply on the fact that they are accounts from different writers Mark and John. The message remains functionally and ontologically the same. It is still from: "The voice that cries in the wilderness, make a straight way for the Lord." Why is this reading and call being repeated this joyful Sunday? It is for the purpose of emphasis. It is to remind us that, though we are given a little time to relax and rejoice today, that the clarion call is still there: "Make a straight way for the Lord." In order words, our preparation continues. So, it is a way of keeping us alert so that we do not lose focus of where we are actually going to: "It is NOT Christmas yet!" The joy of this Sunday foreshadows the fullness of joy that Christmas brings.

# **OPENING PRAYER**

#### FIRST READING Isaiah 61:1-2,10-11

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. "I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. "For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations."

#### **GOSPEL** John 1:6-8,19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, "I am not the Christ." "Well then," they asked "are you Elijah?" "I am not" he said, "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No," So they said to him, "Who are you?" We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?" So John said, "I am as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord." Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, "Why are you baptizing if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?" John replies, "I baptize with water; but there stands among you - unknown to you - the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal strap." This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
