REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

NOT BY MIGHT, GOD ALONE

Our relationship with God is one that is incomparable with any other relationship that we are engaged in. Its significance which is more of a blessing has been misconstrued over the centuries by people called to be partakers in God's saving work to humanity. So for Ananias, a believer in Damascus, it was difficult for him to reconcile the fact that Saul was a changed man who also needed to be saved. He was so much embittered by Saul's acts that even at the command of the Lord he said, 'Lord, many people have told me about this man and about the terrible things he has done to your people in Jerusalem. And he has come to Damascus with authority from the chief priests to arrest all who worship you.' (Acts, 9:13-14). However, Saul believed that it was not by his might but only by the grace of God that he was to be saved by his extraordinary experience on his way to Damascus. This experience would later change his entire approach in life. It is in the context of this experience that Paul writes in our extract from the second reading (1 Cor. 1:26-31) that, 'God purposely chose what the world considers nonsense in order to shame the wise, and he chose what the world considers weak in order to shame the powerful.' (1 Cor. 2:27). Like Paul, we come to God with a firm believe that the 'God talk' will inspire us to be a changed people. Yes we all have the basic tag of 'original sin' but we are not condemned by God hence we are not intimidated by the way people relate to us and what they say about us. I might have strayed from the ways of God but I am not defeated by my failures. I look up to God for strength just like the psalmist tells us, 'My help will come from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.' (Ps. 121:2). I could be the lost sheep but God is ever willing to go after the lost ones just like the man who leaves ninety-nine sheep in the pasture and goes after the one that is lost until he finds it. (Lk. 15:4). Like Paul, let us put all our trust in God in our everyday struggles in life and let us allow the Spirit of God to touch us so that we can always stand firm before the Lord with heads high.
