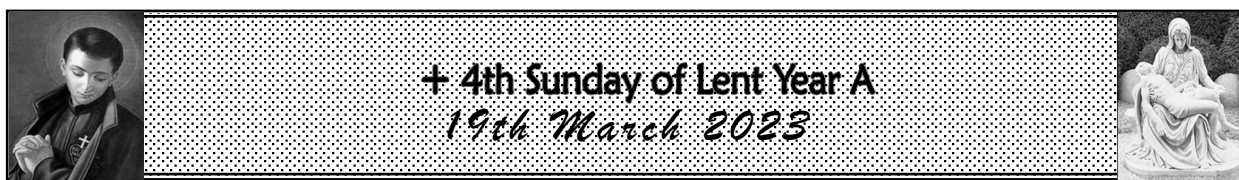

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

God's Unconventional Choices

The indices that guide our natural process of selection will eliminate all others. We are usually guided by track records. Such selections processes have turned out to be wrong. Thus, our process of selection is limited by our universe of knowledge which is a very small fraction of reality. It is often different when God is the choice maker. The emergent choice is always a disappointment for the seasoned mind. Often, it looks like the best is left for a less qualified option but the results, willy nilly, fulfil God's purpose even though the choice appears eccentric. In the book, *God's Eccentric Choices*, George Kaitholi, an Asian writer chronicles the life, mission and message of nine personalities in the Bible that God chose in defiance of human reason. One glaring example is the choice of David in the first reading of today and the blind man in the Gospel. God chooses the small, the weak, the forgotten, anyone! The message is: if we surrender to God and are docile to him, he will, through us, achieve the unimaginable, no matter how small, sick or insignificant we think we are. The conditions he gives are unambiguous - *try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing to do with the futile works of darkness but exposing them by contrast* (Eph 5: 10-11). Go ahead, take that step you have in mind, for God and for the faith!

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

OPENING PRAYER

O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

FIRST READING 1 Sam 16: 1,6-7,10-13

The Lord said to Samuel, "Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen myself a king among his sons." When Samuel arrived, he caught sight of Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed one stands there before him.", but the Lord said to Samuel, "Take no notice of his appearance or his height for I have rejected him; God does not see as man sees; man looks at appearances but the Lord looks at the heart." Jesse presented his seven sons to Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen these." He then asked Jesse, "Are these all the sons you have?" He answered, "There is still one left, the youngest; he is out looking after the sheep." Then Samuel said to Jesse, "Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he comes." Jesse had him sent for, a boy of fresh complexion, with fine eyes and pleasant bearing. The Lord said, "Come, anoint him, for this is the one." At this, Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him where he stood with his brothers; and the spirit of the Lord seized on David and stayed with him from that day on.

SECOND READING Eph 5:8-14

You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord; be like children of light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth. Try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing to do with the futile works of darkness but exposing them by contrast. The things which are done in secret are things that people are ashamed even to speak of; but anything exposed by the light will be illuminated and anything illuminated turns into light. That is why it is said: "Wake from your sleep, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

GOSPEL Jn 9: 1-41 [Shorter form]

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, "Go and wash in the pool of Siloam" (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored. His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, "Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "Yes, it is the same one" Others said, "No, he only looks like him" The man himself said, " I am the man". They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, "He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed , and I can see." Then some of the Pharisees said, "This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the Sabbath." Others said, " How could a sinner produce signs like this?" And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, "What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?" "He is a prophet," replied the man." Are you trying to teach us," they replied, "and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!" And they drove him away. Jesus heard they had driven them away, and when he found him he said to him, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" "Sir," the man replied, "tell me who he is so that I may believe in him." Jesus said, "You are looking at him; he is speaking to you." The man said, "Lord, I believe," and worshipped him.
