



We welcome all to today's Mass, especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Destroy this Temple and in three days I will raise it up': He is no longer speaking of the trade and trafficking going on in the Temple. In fact, John the Evangelist remarks immediately; 'He was speaking of the temple that was his body'. The Jews were convinced that God lived in the Temple of Jerusalem, and that is why they went there to offer Him sacrifices. Jesus now says this type of belief is over. God will soon build a new Temple where one acceptable sacrifice will be offered. The kind of worship and the form of sacrifice will be Jesus Himself. The building will not be made of stones. The building will be a Spiritual building acceptable to God. By raising His son from the dead God has built this new Temple and this was completed on Easter day in three days, therefore, laying the cornerstone of the new Holy place. Those who have accepted the invitation of Jesus form part of this building making the body of Christ the new Temple where God now lives. We can offer sacrifices acceptable to God now, not incense and the blood of animals, but works of charity, the generous service to our neighbour, where the needs of the poorest and the weakest are met in the community, the new body built by the individual members of Christ's disciples. The Gospel speaks about purification of the Temple, it also announces the replacement of the old one with new. We are the new Temple, but we also need purification from all that hinders our offering from being acceptable to God. To be acceptable we are asked to purify our ways of reasoning. We should not think like the Jews and the Greeks, St. Paul tells us in the second reading. The Ten Commandments shows us concretely which sacrifices are acceptable to God. It is an invitation to purify our religion of false notions that do not give proof of our love for God and love for our neigh-

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

OPENING PRAYER

O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

FIRST READING Exodus 20:1-17 (Long version)

God spoke all these words. He said, I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

You shall have no gods except me.

You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. You shall do no work that day, neither you nor your son nor your daughter nor your servants, men or women, nor your animals nor the stranger who lives with you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold, but on the seventh day he rested; that is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it sacred.

'Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to vou.

You shall not kill.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps 18)

R. You, Lord, have the message of eternal life.

The law of the Lord is perfect, it revives the soul. The rule of the Lord is to be trusted, it gives wisdom to the simple. R.

The precepts of the Lord are right, they gladden the heart. The command of the Lord is clear, it gives light to the eyes.

The fear of the Lord is holy. abiding for ever. The decrees of the Lord are truth and all of them just. R.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

GOSPEL John 2: 13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.
