REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them light has shone. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder" (Isa 9,2-3). Jesus has started calling those who will help him in his mission of dispelling darkness from human world. "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people" (Mt 4,18-20). The Apostles, Peter, Andrew, James, John and others were ordinary people. They were not twelve copies of the same type. Jesus did not destroy their individuality. Each after his own kind was needed to enrich the kingdom of God. Jesus did not obliterate their distinctiveness. He gathered them all into an orchestra of praise. They were friendly, honest, enthusiastic people. Jesus counted on them. He gave much of his time and energy to instruct them and form them. These men were courageous. They realize that their boat is so small and the sea is large. But they are ready to risk and face the fury of the sea. Once there came to Socrates a very ordinary man called Aeschines. "I am a poor man," said Aeschines. "I have nothing else, but I give you myself. " "Do you not see" said Socrates, " that you are giving me the most precious thing of all." What Jesus needs is not wealth or scholarship but ourselves. Jesus can do everything with people who give themselves to him. We are called to be fishers of men. Like good fishermen we have to be patient. With patience and perseverance we shall succeed to effect a change and bring light in ourselves and in others.



For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.

SECOND READING *1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17*

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgement. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarrelling among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each one of you says, 'I follow Paul', or 'I follow Apollos', or 'I follow Cephas', or 'I follow Christ.' Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise but to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

GOSPEL *Matthew 4:12-23*

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee. And leaving Nazareth he went and lived in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: 'The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles — the people dwelling in darkness have seen a great light, and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned.' From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him. And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people.
