# REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

"All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel" (Mt 1,22-23). The readings of today understand the virginal conception of Jesus as a divine work that surpasses all human understanding and possibility. "That which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit" (Mt, 20), said the angel to Joseph about Mary his fiancée. The Church sees here the fulfilment of the divine promise given through the prophet Isaiah. This can only be understood through faith which connects the mysteries in the totality of Christ's mysteries, from his Incarnation to his Passover. "Mary's virginity and giving birth, and even the Lord's death escaped the notice of the prince of this world: these three mysteries worthy of proclamation were accomplished in God's silence" (CCC 498). Jesus came to" save his people from their sins. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus" said the angel to Joseph. The name "Jesus" means" Yahweh sets free", "God saves", "God helps". To save means to set free from evil. Jesus Christ is the saviour of the world since he came to free the human person from that fundamental evil which has invaded man's inner being throughout the whole course of his history, after the first breach of the covenant with the Creator. The evil of sin is precisely the fundamental evil which comes between humanity and the realization of the Kingdom of God. A mother tells of her daughter complaining that she was afraid to be alone in the dark. The mother said, "Remember that Jesus is with you." The child replied, "I know, but I want someone with some skin on them." In Emmanuel God has taken on our skin. God becomes skin of our skin and flesh of our flesh. God shares with us our trials, pains, temptations, disappointments and fears. So let us rejoice and welcome Jesus our SAVIOUR.

# GOSPEL Matthew 1: 18-24

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel'—which means, God with us. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.

The third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, is so called from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon at Mass, 'Gaudete', i.e. 'Rejoice'. The season of Advent originated as a fast of forty days in preparation for Christmas. In the ninth century, the duration of Advent was reduced to four weeks, and by the twelfth century the fast had been replaced by simple abstinence. St. Gregory the Great was the first to draw up an Office for the Advent season, and the Gregorian Sacramentary is the earliest to provide Masses for the Sundays of Advent. Gaudete Sunday, signifies the nearness of the Lord's coming. In both Office

and Mass throughout Advent continual reference is made to our Lord's second coming, and this is emphasised on the third Sunday by the additional signs of gladness permitted on that day. Gaudete Sunday is further marked by the Church no longer inviting the faithful to adore merely "The Lord who is to come", but calling upon them to worship and hail with joy "The Lord who is now nigh and close at hand". The Epistle again incites us to rejoicing, and bids us prepare to meet the coming Saiour prayers and supplication and thanksgiving, whilst the Gospel, the words of St. John Baptist, warns us that the Lamb of God is even now in our midst, though we appear to know Him not. The spirit of the Office and Liturgy all through Advent is one of expectation and preparation for the Christmas feast as well as for the second coming of Christ. Penitential exercises are suspended on Gaudete Sunday in order to symbolise that joy and gladness in the Promised Redemption which should never be absent from the hearts of the faithful.

### THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God; begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father. Through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, (all bow) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
