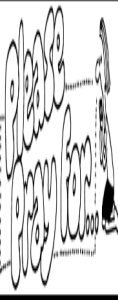

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

Most of those coming to John the Baptist for baptism were repentant sinners. Our baptism, too, is partly to rescue us from the power of sin. How does Jesus himself fit into this? There are two answers we can give to this question: 1. By being baptised in the River Jordan with all those self-proclaimed sinners, Jesus shows his total solidarity with us. "The Word was made flesh and lived among us," says John's gospel. This solidarity was indicated by the criticism of the Pharisees that Jesus spent so much time eating and drinking with sinners and outcasts. 2. Something different is happening here beyond an ordinary baptism. The Gospel says significantly that Jesus was at prayer when his baptism took place. At all the significant moments in his public life, Jesus is presented as praying. It was at this moment that the Spirit of God in the visible form of a dove comes down on him. And then came the voice of the Father clearly endorsing the work that Jesus is about to begin. So, through his baptism, Jesus is being officially commissioned to begin his public work of teaching, healing and liberating enslaved souls up to the climactic moment of his passion, death and resurrection. Today is an opportunity for us to reflect on our own baptisms too. It is not something which happened a long time ago and which "made" us Catholics. It is not just a ceremony lasting a few minutes which produces magical effects; it is the beginning of a life-long journey. It is the beginning of a process of growing into the Body of Christ as its members. It involves active participation in the life of the Church and not just passive membership. Our baptism is a never-ending call to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Each one of us is called to be a living witness to the Gospel: to be the salt of the earth, a city on a hill, a lamp radiating light for all.

TODAY’S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

After the Lord was baptised, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, whom I am well pleased.

Opening Prayer

Almighty, eternal God, who, when Christ had been baptised in the River Jordan and as the Holy Spirit descended upon him, solemnly declared him your beloved Son, grant that you children by adoption, reborn of water and Holy Spirit, may always be pleasing to you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

First Reading Isaiah 42:1-4.6-7

Thus says the LORD: Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law. ‘I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.’

Responsorial Psalm (29)(28): 1-2

R. The LORD will bless his people with peace.

Ascribe to the LORD, you heavenly powers, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name; bow down before the LORD, majestic in holiness. R.

The voice of the LORD upon the waters, the LORD on the immensity of waters; the voice of the LORD full of power; the voice of the LORD full of splendour. R.

The God of glory thunders; in his temple they all cry, ‘Glory!’ The LORD sits enthroned above the flood; the LORD sits as king for ever. R.

Second Reading Acts 10: 34-38

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: ‘Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all — you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.’

Gospel Acclamation

The heavens were opened and the voice of the Father thundered: ‘This is my beloved Son; listen to him’.

Gospel Matthew 3:13-17.

At that time: Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptised by him. John would have prevented him, saying, ‘I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?’ But Jesus answered him, ‘Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness.’ Then he consented. And when Jesus was baptised, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, ‘This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.’

Prayer over the gifts Accept, O Lord, the offerings we have brought to honour the revealing of your beloved Son, so that the oblation of your faithful may be transformed into the sacrifice of him who willed in his compassion to wash away the sins of the world. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Communion Antiphon Behold the One of whom John said: I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God. Prayer after communion Nourished with these sacred gifts, we humbly en-	treat your mercy, O Lord, that, faithfully listening to your Only Begotten Son, we may be your children in name and in truth. Through Christ our Lord. SPIRITUAL COMMUNION PRAYER (For Online Mass) My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
