## + Palm Sunday Of The Passion Of The Lord 28th March 2021

We welcome all to today's Mass, especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

### REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

#### Name your donkey

Discerning Jews at the time must have been stunned by the precision with which the manner of Jesus' triumphant Palm Sunday entry into Jerusalem fulfilled the prophecy of Zechariah (9:9): "Rejoice greatly, O! Daughter of Zion, shout aloud O! Daughter of Jerusalem, lo your king comes to you, triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey...." With the corruption in the Temple and the failings of successive kings, the nation of Israel had suffered. As the people began to dream and long for the return of the ideal king, the true David, who will liberate them, the prophets indicate that Yahweh (God Himself) will come to reign as king precisely through a son of David who will enter the Holy city. However, as Zechariah prophesied, he will enter, not as a conquering hero riding a chariot, but as a humble figure riding a young donkey. In other words, he would not be a political Messiah but one who would save his people from their sins as the angel foretold: "And now she (Mary) will bear a son. You shall call him 'Jesus' for he will save his people from their sins" (Mt. 1:21). This triumphant entry begins the overpowering drama of the passion with Jesus the tragic hero acting with awesome dignity. But, there were also many actors and actresses in "supporting" roles whose performances elicit all shades of emotions from us. Indeed, no one can escape the cross but you can choose how you respond. It would therefore be worth reflecting in which of the scenes I can see myself and with which of the characters I can be identified. For this moment however, I want to draw our attention to some characters that may easily be overlooked but whose role actually tells the whole story of how the Passion is calling us to respond. It is the story of the unnamed donkey owners who lent Jesus their donkey for the ride into Jerusalem. Had they refused to donate their donkey, perhaps the story of the triumphal entry would have had a hitch. Thus, the lesson from them is that no matter how unknown a person is, he or she can still play a decisive role in the unfolding of God's plan. Each of us has got a donkey that the Lord needs; something in our lives, which, if given back to God, could, like the donkey, move Jesus and his story further down the road. Maybe you can sing, maybe you can read, maybe you can clean, make a visit, give a welcoming hug or even write a cheque.

# TODAY'S READINGS

## GOSPEL (Mark 11:1-10)

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat: untie it and bring it. If any one says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus, and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!"

## ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

Six days before the solemn Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!"

Almighty, ever-living God, who as an example of humility for the human race to follow, caused our Saviour to take flesh and submit to the Cross, graciously grant that we may heed his lesson of patient suffering and so merit a share in his Resurrection. ## The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark 15: 1-39

First thing in the morning, the chief priests together with the elders and scribes, in short the whole Sanhedrin, had their plan ready. They had Jesus bound and took him away and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate questioned him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' He answered, 'It is you who say it.' And the chief priests brought many accusations against him. Pilate questioned him again, 'Have you no reply at all? See how many accusations they are bringing against you! But, to Pilate's amazement, Jesus made no further reply. At festival time Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone they asked for. Now a man called Barabbas was then in prison with the rioters who had committed murder during the uprising. When the crowd went up and began to ask Pilate the customary favour, Pilate answered them, 'Do you want me released for you the king of the Jews?' For he realised it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed Jesus over. The chief priests, however, had incited the crowd to demand that he should release Barabbas for them instead. Then Pilate spoke again. 'But in that case, what am I to do with the man you call king of the Jews?' They shouted back, '**CRUCIFY HIM!**' Pilate asked them, 'Why? What harm has he done?' But they shouted all the louder, '**CRUCIFY HIM!**' So Pilate, anxious to placate the crowd, released Barabbas for them and, having ordered Jesus to be scourged, handed him over to be crucified. The soldiers led him away to the inner part of the palace, that is, the Praetorium, and called the cohort together. They dressed him up in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on him. And they began saluting him, '**HAIL, KING OF THE JEWS!**' They struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and they went down on their knees to do him homage. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple and dressed him in his own clothes. They led him out to crucify him. They enlisted a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of the skull. They offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he refused it. Then they crucified him, and shared out his clothing, casting lots to decide what each should get. It was the third hour when they crucified him. The inscription giving the charges against read: 'The King of the Jews'. And they crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left. The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said, '**AHA! SO YOU WOULD DESTROY THE TEMPLE AND REBUILD IT IN THREE DAYS! THEN SAVE YOURSELF: COME DOWN FROM THE CROSS!**' The chief priests and the scribes mocked him among themselves in the same way. They said '**HE SAVED OTHERS, HE CANNOT SAVE HIMSELF. LET THE CHRIST, THE KING OF ISRAEL, COME DOWN FROM THE CROSS NOW, FOR US TO SEE IT AND BELIEVE.**' Even those who were crucified with him taunted him. When the sixth hour came there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' This means 'My God, my God, why have you deserted me?' When some of those who stood by heard this, they said, '**LISTEN, HE IS CALLING ON ELIJAH.**' Someone ran and soaked a sponge in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink saying, '**WAIT AND SEE IF ELIJAH WILL COME TO TAKE HIM DOWN.**' But Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. **All kneel for a few moments**

And the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The centurion, who was standing in front of him, had seen how he had died, and he said, 'In truth this man was a son of God.'
