REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

Advent is the season that begins the Church's Liturgical Year. This weekend is the beginning of a new Liturgical Year C or 3. Advent originated in the early Church as a short period of intense preparation for the celebration of the nativity of the Lord on Dec. 25. Advent slowly came to be structured into four Sundays with proper readings and prayers. The Advent Wreath is a circle of evergreen branches with four candles on it. Each Sunday of Advent one candle is lit. The liturgical colour of Advent is violet or purple, and Rose used only on the third Sunday of Advent, otherwise known as the 'Gaudete Sunday.' During Advent, the playing of musical instruments as well as the floral decoration of the altar should be marked by a moderation that reflects the character of this season. Two biblical figures accompany us during this time of Advent are, John the Baptist and Mary. John the Baptist is the prophet who was sent to prepare the way of the Lord and herald His coming. Mary holds a special place in the history of Salvation. "Advent" means "coming" and the three readings of this first Sunday speak of "comings." This season is marked by devout and joyful expectation as we recall the first humble coming of the Lord at Bethlehem. At the same time, we are invited to direct our mind and heart towards Christ's coming in mystery and His final coming in glory at the end of time. This is well expressed both in the Scripture readings, in the prayers as well as in the two parts into which Advent is divided. During the first part of Advent, until 16 Dec., the focus of the liturgy is on the second coming of the Lord, while during the second part, from 17 to 24 Dec., the emphasis is on the immediate preparation for Christmas. These two 'comings' of the Lord are connected by the daily coming of the Lord in our life through His Word, Sacraments, other people and events. Our welcoming of the Lord in our daily life is the best way for us to prepare for His coming in mystery and in glory at the end of time. Our listening to the Word of God leads us to develop some inner attitudes during Advent. On this first Sunday of Advent, there is an insistent call to watchfulness, to being on guard. Vigilance and preparation while waiting for the coming of the Lord in mystery and in glory at the end of time are urged. Information has it that in RAF Museum in Hendon, here in England there is an exhibition of the memorabilia of Lord Dowding. He was appointed Commander in Chief of the RAF in 1936 to take on the challenge of expanding the RAF's fighting force to meet the Nazi threat. Lord Dowding has less than 4years to prepare for the epic Battle of Britain, while at the same time helping France. Lord Dowding's accomplishments in getting the RAF ready are summed up on a plaque: "It has been given to few men so to employ so short a time that by their efforts they saved civilization." Lord Dowding's vigilance while waiting are part of the theme of today's Advent gospel. Have a faith-filled Advent Season!
