We welcome all to today's Mass, especially visitors who are celebrating with us for the first time. Please take this bulletin home with you for further reflection on this week's celebration and to follow the activities in the Parish during the week.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles. One remarkable effect of that experience was that the disciples spoke in tongues (their message was meaningful across linguistic divides). This experience has been interpreted in so many different ways. But an understanding of Jesus' own 'Pentecost' experience will give us an insight into what Pentecost experience implies. In Luke 4:18-19 Jesus announces that the spirit of the Lord is upon him (his own Pentecost experience) and he goes on immediately to state the implication of this experience; he says - it has empowered me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, to give new sight to the blind, to declare freedom to the oppressed and announce the coming of God's favour! In other words, the spirit empowered him to carry out his mission of love across racial and linguistic boundaries. The Gospels are full of graphic illustrations of how Jesus, empowered by the Spirit, successfully delivered on these missions; restoring the sick to health, the blind to sight, the oppressed to freedom, the hungry to fullness. To speak in a language that is meaningful to people is therefore to intervene meaningfully in people's trying life situations.

TODAY'S READINGS

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

OPENING PRAYER

O God, who by the mystery of today's great feast sanctify your whole Church in every people and nation, pour out, we pray, the gifts of the Holy Spirit across the face of the earth and, with the divine grace that was at work when the Gospel was first proclaimed, fill now once more the hearts of believers. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

FIRST READING Acts 2: 1-11

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps 103)

R. **Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth**

Bless the Lord, my soul!
Lord God, how great you are.
How many are your works, O Lord!

SECOND READING Galatians 5:16-25

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility;

idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warn you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit. The word of the Lord.
